## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The documents in this collection detail the activities of one individual, Douglas R. Price, and three organizations which focused their attention on intergovernmental relations. The documents span the period 1955-1960, with the majority falling in the period 1957-1960.

Douglas R. Price, who worked under Deputy Assistant to the President for Interdepartmental Affairs Robert E. Merriam, coordinated staff work in the area of federal participation in the activities of the Joint Federal-State Action Committee. In this capacity, and in his other roles in the sphere of intergovernmental relations, he accumulated this rather heterogeneous file.

The Commission on Intergovernmental Relations was established by President Eisenhower to identify ways in which responsibility for domestic activities of the federal government could be turned over to the states. This commission was succeeded in July 1957 by the Joint Federal-State Action Committee (JFSAC). The committee provided liaison between the federal departments and agencies and the Council of State Governments on numerous problems of common interest to local, state, and federal governments. JFSAC made its final report to the President in February 1960 and was dissolved. Subsequently, Congress established the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (ACIR) as a bipartisan commission to carry out functions similar to those of JFSAC.

The collection is organized in five series. The first three series contain records of the three organizations discussed above. They include background studies on numerous topics of interest to both state and federal governments, summaries of meetings, minutes, resolutions, and a small amount of correspondence. The JFSAC series is divided into five sub-series which include a Meeting File, a Report File, a Subject File, a Chronological File, and a Miscellaneous File. The first two sub-series contain agenda, summaries of proposals, verbatim transcripts of meetings, and drafts and final copies of correspondence relating to the various reports written by the Committee. The Subject File contains reports, statements, congressional testimony, and resolutions on a myriad of topics in which state and federal government interface. Atomic energy, taxes, school financing, and health programs are the most frequently mentioned topics. The last two sub-series contain mostly routine correspondence and memoranda.

Items in the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations series focus on the same topics as noted in the previous series. The types of documents include briefing papers, minutes, reports, correspondence, memoranda, and press releases.

The Douglas R. Price File is divided into three sub-series. The Subject File contains items on a miscellany of topics, most notably aging, taxes, and state financial procedures. There is also one folder of Republican party material. The second sub-series contains items for and about governors' conferences and White House correspondence with governors. Topics covered include migratory labor, residence requirements for public assistance, and law enforcement. The third subseries does not pertain to federal-state relations. It consists of 1956 White house correspondence with the general public about issues raised in the political campaign. This material was given to Price in 1960 for the apparent reason that he was to handle this type of correspondence in that election year.

The final series contains publications by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and the White House Conference on Aging. These documents discuss programs for the aged at both the local and national levels.

In addition to being a useful source of information on numerous domestic issues of the last half of the 1950s, this collection is also a valuable source on federalism in general and the attitudes of political leaders toward the proper roles of local, state, and federal governments in domestic affairs.

The arrangement of the collection was provided by the archivist.
