2006-2-1: Panoramic photograph of the 47<sup>th</sup> Annual Commencement, Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C., June 10, 1936. One 10 x 36 b/w print.

2006-2-2: Photograph of Edward Lilly, ca. 1939. One 2 ½ x 2 ½ b/w print.

2006-2-3: Photograph of Nancy Lilly (wife of Edward) and daughter, Anna Marie, ca. 1939. Two 2 ½ x 2 ½ b/w prints.

2006-2-4: “The crater of a German fort blown up when they retreated from the Hindenburg line; June 11, 1928.” One 2 5/8 x 4 ¼ b/w print.

2006-2-5: “Monument commemorating the signing of the Armistice, Forest of Compiègne; June 11, 1928.” One 2 5/8 x 4 ¼ b/w print.

2006-2-6: Photo of Edward Lilly, undated but apparently taken to be used for his trip to Europe in May—August 1945. Envelope has label for Cullen Photo Company, Washington, D.C., with “London Trip” handwritten on it. Two 2 ½ x 3 ½ b/w prints.

2006-2-7: Photograph of a Japanese propaganda leaflet with annotation REST JICPOA NEG 50204-9. Text: “SPRING DANCE—We’ve got oomph and we’ve got curves, We’ve got stars and a lot of stripes; We’ve got passion and we’ve got breasts; We’ve got everything ‘cept our desire, And only the crosses mark them here.” Motifs include American flag, five nude cartoon women dancing among crosses. 2006-2-18: "PNA EA 60049 AMERICANS ORDER NAZI TROOPS TO SURRENDER: Members of a psychological warfare unit attached to the Ninth Armored Division, First U.S. Army, order the surrender of Nazi soldiers in a nearby town over the loudspeaker of a mobile public address system. Operating the unit March 27, 1945, is Private Paul A. Eisler (seated in jeep) of San Francisco, California, and Private Charles Levelle of Manchester, New Hampshire. 2006-2-19: "BIPPA EA 37372 PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE LEAFLET PERSUADES NAZIS TO SURRENDER: A 24-year-old Nazi paratrooper who took the advice of an Allied leaflet and surrendered to American troops in France hands over his surrender pass, guaranteeing him safe passage, to lieutenant F.F. Kinney of Chicago, Illinois, who received the safe conduct leaflet, interviewed the German soldier and saw him transported safely to a prisoner-of-war camp. The leaflet was prepared by the Psychological Warfare Division of the Allied Expeditionary Force and was fired over enemy positions by light artillery. U.A. Signal Corps Photo ETO-HQ-44-14447. Mr. Bishop, chief of the recording section of the unit, was formerly professor of Romance languages at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. Corporal Joseph Eaton (left ) assists with the recording. The psychological warfare leaflets are for the people of this aircraft manufacturing town. Directly below the cloud of leaflets can be seen bomb strikes on the target area. 2006-2-22: "BIPPA FRA 203618 U.S. GROUP CONTROL COUNCIL CHART: This is a chart showing organization of the U.S. Group Control Council in Germany. Plans for German control were revealed in Paris May 17, 1945, by Lieutenant General Lucius Clay, Deputy Military Governor for the Reich under General Eisenhower. The control period is scheduled to begin "in a few months" as soon as occupation troops of America, England, Russia and France have been deployed to their respective zones. General Eisenhower who represents the United States on the United Nations Control Council, will command the American zone. U.S. Signal Corps Photo ETO-HQ-45-27943.
