Lawyer, active in California Republican politics, member of state legislature, 1927-1934, advisor to Governor Earl Warren on taxes.

DESCRIPTION: Family background; education at the University of California at Berkeley and Harvard Law School; joining the legal firm of Jesse H. Steinhart; going to the state legislature; role in tax system reorganization; necessity for sales and income taxes; campaign for those taxes; role in influencing the legislature; influence of the press; withdrawal from active politics; assisting Earl Warren in legislature in 1945; Karl Benedetsen; Japanese-American relocation; 1946 gubernatorial race; 1942 gubernatorial race; Steinhart's role in political and civic affairs; the one-man, one-vote decision of the Warren court.
